CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION

Featured Project—Bay Bridge Rd./CPR Overhead Replacement & Dundas St. W. Rehabilitation

In the summer of 2017 one of the most anticipated and largest capital construction projects under the Build Belleville umbrella was completed. This Project included the replacement of the existing structure on Bay Bridge Rd., which crossed over the CP Railway, with a new structure on a new alignment. The Project also included the reconstruction of the Dundas St. W./Bay Bridge Rd. intersection and the rehabilitation of Dundas St. W. including the addition of turning lanes.

Also included in this Project was the construction of a Parkette dedicated to the Hastings and Prince Edward Regiment in Belleville.

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DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY


NEW CONSTRUCTION

The number of new dwelling units constructed in 2017 was an all-time record for the City of Belleville totalling 467 units compared with 319 in 2016, This is directly attributed to the number of new apartment buildings and condominium units being constructed. The local home builders continue to be very busy with new home construction with a number of the builders booking closings well into 2019.

SITE PLAN APPROVALS

In 2017 the City approved 20 site plans for commercial, industrial and multi-residential development. This includes a new beer store at Quinte Mall, further redevelopment of the old Zellers property and a new nine story apartment building on College St. W.
