1.0 Introduction

The City of Belleville initiated this Class Environmental Assessment (EA) in August of 2014 in order to move forward with reconstruction and provision of full municipal servicing for Mineral Road, Maitland Drive and Farnham Road.

This EA Study will complete all phases of the Municipal Class EA by establishing the need and justification for the project, considering all alternatives and proactively involving the public in defining a recommended plan for improvements.

This assignment is following the approved Planning and Design process of the "Municipal Class Environmental Assessment", as amended in 2011, for a

Schedule 'C' project. This is a selfassessment process that includes mandatory public consultation.

This Study is being completed as a Schedule 'C' undertaking, based on the range of anticipated effects (i.e. minor environmental impacts) and capital cost of the roadway.


At the completion of the Schedule C project, an Environmental Study Report (ESR) will be prepared for a 30-day public review.

The project location is shown in **Figure**1 and the study area is shown in **Figure**2.





City of Belleville and consultant representatives were available to respond to any inquiries.

All members of the public and interest groups were invited to the Public Information Centre to view the presentation material and to discuss the project with the City and consultant representatives.

Fifty (50) people registered at the Public Information Centre. Each person was encouraged to provide a written response to any issues or concerns.

2.0 PUBLIC AND AGENCY CONSULTATION

One of the key aspects of the project is to provide the public, interested parties, affected agencies and municipalities with the opportunity for input. In order to ensure this objective is met, a public and agency notification program was undertaken. The program includes a number of communication mechanisms, discussed in the following sections. A Study Design was released for public review with no comments received to change the scope of the project.

2.1 Individual Property Owner Contacts

Flyers (approximately 100) were mailed to all property owners within the study area, inviting them to attend the Public Information Centre. A sample of the flyer letter is provided in **Appendix A**.

2.2 Newspaper Notice

Notice of the Public Information Centre was placed in The Belleville Intelligencer on January 7th and January 10th, 2015 and the Quinte News website on January 14th, 2015.

3.0 PIC COMMENTS

Display panels/boards were set up around the perimeter of the room, to be viewed at leisure. A copy of the PIC presentation boards is provided in **Appendix C**.

Sixteen (16) comment sheets were received at the PIC. Five (5) emails were received during the subsequent 2-week comment period. Copies of the comments, excluding personal information, are provided in **Appendix D**. The results of the comments and discussions are summarized in the following sections.

3.1 Summary of Comments

The results of the comments received and discussions held at the Public Information Centre are summarized below in **Table 1**. The comments have been summarized by general subject matter.

Comments raised by the public include:

- Strong support from the public on the roundabout recommendation.
- Identification of a new alternative on Farnham Road to flatten the substandard curve. This new alternative does not require the buyout property at 158 Farnham Road.

- First Nations contact attendee requested to be added to the mailing list, and to receive background reports (interested especially in the environmental background reports).
- Numerous residents provided comments and confirmation on locations for service connections.
- Comments from the public support on the two Maitland Drive alignment alternatives presented at the PIC; supported using the south alignment alternative (less impact to existing residential properties).
- Trucking company on Parks Drive that has oversized trucks. These trucks will need to find an alternate route than using the roundabout (from Maitland over the bridge and vice versa).
- Flooding in Norbelle creek has been a concern from snow dumping.

- Strong support for improvements to Maitland Drive potholes.
- Sidewalks strongly supported by public along Farnham and Maitland.
- Cycling lanes or room on the side of the road for cyclists.
- Developers identified a need for future intersection on Farnham Road between Kipling Drive and Scott Drive.
