Councillor Denyes thanked the media for their assistance with highlighting issues related to the Lahr Student Exchange Program.

Councillor Boyce spoke about a forthcoming report on e-bikes. Acting Director of Corporate Services/Clerk, Matt MacDonald, indicated the report would be before Council at the February 10, 2014 Council Meeting.

Councillor Jenkins requested an update on the casino project. His Worship Mayor Ellis provided an update. Chief Administrative Officer, Rick Kester, also provided further information. The Chief Administrative Officer indicated, where possible, Council will be provided with an update as information is learned. The Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation had to cancel the last scheduled meeting with the City.

Councillor Christopher thanked the Finance Department regarding a City Tax brochure and sought some clarification on some of the information contained in the brochure. The Director of Finance/Treasurer, Brian Cousins, provided clarification. Councillor Christopher also noted that he had concerns with the Traffic Advisory Committee response to a citizen's request for signage regarding speed limits on McDougall Drive.

13. ANNOUNCEMENTS

Councillor Thompson spoke about attending the Gleaners Food Bank Gala Dinner and that the event raised \$20,000.00. He also spoke about the \$64,000.00 raised locally for the Alzheimers Society by the recent "Walk for Memories" in which he also participated.

Director of Fire and Emergency Services/Fire Chief, Mark MacDonald, spoke about the importance of clearing snow from natural gas meters and vents at homes in order to prevent potentially dangerous situations. He stated residents should contact the Belleville Fire Department if they have any questions or need assistance.

The Director of Engineering and Development Services, Rod Bovay, announced a Public Information Center to be held at 116 Pinnacle Street from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on January 28th regarding the North East Feedermain. He also mentioned an Open House scheduled for February 5th, at 116 Pinnacle Street beginning at 6:00 p.m. regarding the Downtown Revitalization project.

His Worship Mayor Ellis asked the Manager of Transportation, Pat McNulty to address Council and the public. Mr. McNulty advised of the need for people to be cautious of snow banks and that children playing on and around them creates a dangerous situation. Regarding snow plowing, he explained primary roads and sidewalks are the priority and then the secondary roads and sidewalks are cleared. He noted the time it takes to remove snow and that City crews have been working diligently.

His Worship Mayor Ellis spoke about the elevator repair at City Hall and how the elevator will be out of service beginning January 28th. The February 10th Council meeting will be held in the Multi-Purpose Room at the Quinte Sports and Wellness Centre and is fully accessible. It is anticipated Council will be back in the Council Chamber for the March 24th meeting.
