10. NEW BUSINESS

His Worship Mayor Panciuk spoke about the cancellation of all City events in May which has now been extended until the end of June. The situation will continue to be monitored into the summer months. Mayor Panciuk advised that he has been personally informed of other cancellations such as the remainder of the Belleville Senators' A.H.L. season and the Belleville Agricultural Society has cancelled the 2020 Quinte Exhibition Fall Fair. The Belleville Chamber of Commerce is contracted by the City to host various events and this also will continue to be monitored.

Mayor Panciuk also spoke about City of Belleville bag tags and garbage pick-up during the Covid-19 crisis. Since April 20, a limit of 2 bags (without bag tags) is permitted per property. Effective June 1st, residents will be permitted just one bag without a bag tag and starting July 1st, bag tags will be required as they may now be purchased on-line.

Mayor Panciuk stated that the Covid-19 crisis has mostly shown the best in people however unfortunately, not all are stepping up during this most difficult situation. Many tenants at the Bell Front plaza have been issued landlords distress warrants by Dav Part Inc. Mayor Panciuk expressed his disappointment in the matter as the City has given landlords some relief in the form of tax deferrals which it was expected would assist the tenants as well.

Councillor Williams spoke about the Pop-up Shop program which has received 11 applicants – mostly food and water-based businesses. He also spoke about the current fiscal situation and is concerned with tax rates and the impact on residents and businesses. Councillor Williams requested a 2020 revised budget by the end of the week to all Council members with Council to consider by the end of the month.

Councillor Carr noted the Planning Advisory Committee is resuming next week and questioned whether Council should consider rescinding the delegated approval authority. The Chief Administrative Officer and City Clerk provided some clarification on the mechanics and process to rescind.

Councillor Thompson sought information on the 2020 Operating Budget with costs regarding Covid-19 and the resumption of the Finance Committee.

His Worship Mayor Panciuk identified many of the steps taken since the on-set of this crisis and why now is not the time to proceed with the budget.

Councillor Sandison spoke on behalf of the Finance Committee and encouraged members of Council to send issues or questions related to the budget to him as the Chair of the committee. He noted a number of variables are unknown and the Director of Finance is working towards a budget.

Councillor Malette noted a disconnect in information regarding the full picture in relation to the budget stating the need for bi-weekly briefing notes on the City of Belleville's financial position. Councillor Carr also requested a confidential briefing note similar to the last one of April 18 and every 30 days.

Mayor Panciuk took a few moments to speak about former Belleville Councillor Mike Graham who is currently receiving palliative care at home after fighting a long battle for the last 5 years. He served for over 30 years with Belleville Police and also a term on Belleville City Council. Mayor Panciuk asked that everyone keep him and his family in thoughts and prayers today.

Mayor Panciuk also reminded everyone of the importance of checking in on friends and neighbours and helping during this stressful time. He also thanked staff and especially the I.T. department for technical support of the new Council meeting format. He also thanked all residents who are still out working in the City of Belleville.
