## 10. **NEW BUSINESS**

Councillor Miller spoke of a problem with geese along Cannifton Road near Byron Street as well as Bell Boulevard. The sidewalks are covered with excrement and he is seeking some action on addressing this issue. Manager of Parks & Open Spaces, Larry Glover, advised of a sidewalk vacuum sweeper that could be utilized for clean-up.
