And whereas, one of the new requirements of this act will be for each Ontario municipality to appoint an Integrity Commissioner to investigate complaints, provide advice and conduct investigations related to conflict of interest and the municipality's code of conduct;

And whereas, the Council of the City of Belleville strongly supports the highest ethical behavior and adherence to all applicable legislation of our members of council and local boards of the municipality:

Therefore be it resolved, that the City of Belleville supports the adoption of the following bylaw to establish the appointment of an Integrity Commissioner with duties and powers consistent with the new legislation in advance of being required to by provincial regulation and gives a **first reading** on this 11th day of September 2017; and,
