885/15 THAT staff prepare a report for Council's consideration regarding the issue of streetlights in tax billing tables 1, 2 and 3 with recommendations to either adjust the tax bills for residents who do not have streetlights but are charged for the service or that streetlights be installed in all three billing tables noted where residents are currently paying for but not receiving the service.

Councillor Carr rose on a point of personal privilege and was recognized by the Chair. During Councillor Carr's motion to delete Item 7-15 (Canada 150 Historical Films), the Chair made several comments eluding to Councillor Carr and that by making such motion, he was not loyal to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II or his employer, the Government of Canada. Councillor Carr noted that while it could be suggested the comments were made in jest, they were made in an open Council Meeting and streamed live on the internet, forming part of the public record. As a member of Council and a sworn member of the Correctional Services of Canada. Councillor Carr stated he takes these oaths very seriously and found these comments questioned his integrity. He also commented that in order to maintain political neutrality, he makes a point of never discussing issues related to his employment and was disappointed that his employment was eluded to during discussion. He requested His Worship Mayor Christopher retract his comments and apologize. Christopher took full responsibility, formally retracted his statements and sincerely apologized.

His Worship Mayor Christopher mentioned the upcoming Foxboro Santa Claus Parade being held on November 28th at 12:30. Councillors wishing to participate are asked to meet at the Foxboro Public School at 11:30 a.m.

Mayor Christopher also spoke about a vigil held on Sunday in Market Square in respect for the citizens of Paris. Officer Todd Bennett of the Belleville Police Service organized this event which was also attended by several other law enforcement officers, members of the public and members of Council.

Mayor Christopher commented on the success of this year's Belleville Santa Claus parade and thanked the Belleville Chamber of Commerce, members of Council, City staff and all of the participants. He also spoke about the Christmas Lighting display ceremony and thanked City staff and the volunteers whose hard work made this event possible. He identified that part of the display features refurbished "Foster Family" lights from the original display honouring the two young men who lost their lives on Christmas Eve in 1958. Councillor Thompson also thanked the Christmas Lighting Display Committee, Council and staff, volunteers and the corporate sponsors for making the Christmas Lighting Display such a success.
